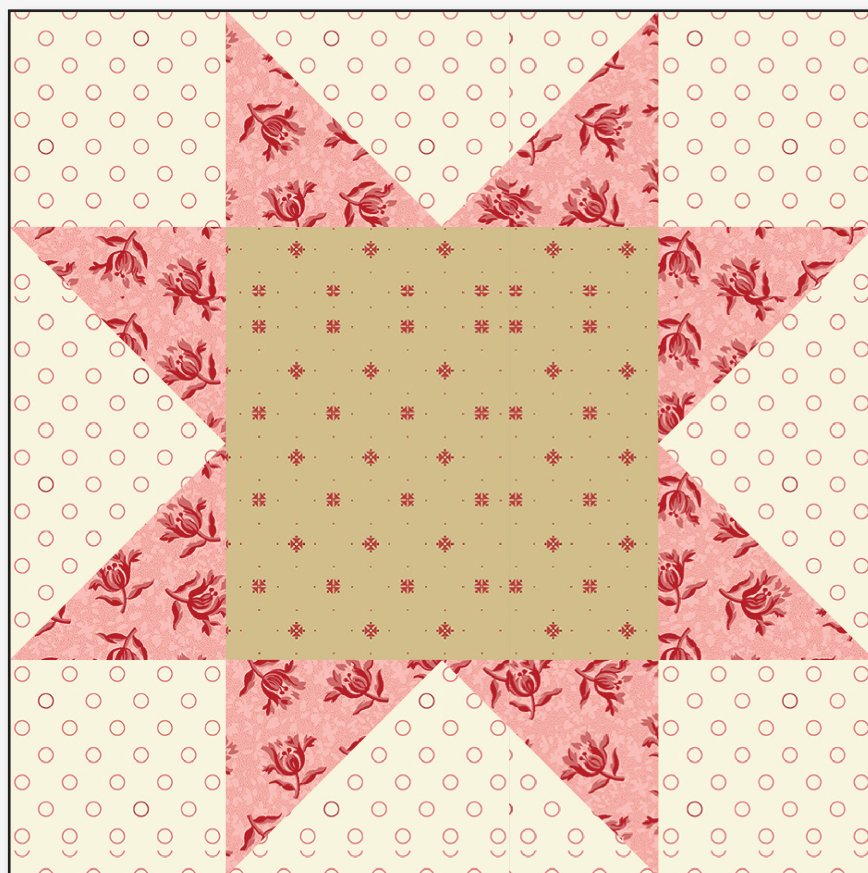


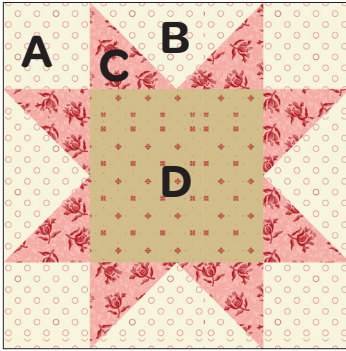
Sawtooth Star Block

Cutting Instructions

Flying Geese - Four at a Time:

(B) - (1) $7\frac{1}{2}$ " sq; or $7\frac{3}{4}$ " extra for trim down

(C) - (4) 4" ; or $4\frac{1}{4}$ " extra for trim down

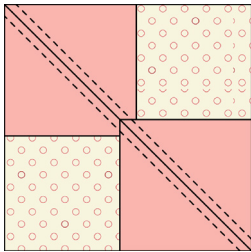
Squares:

(D) - (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " sq

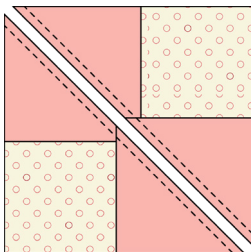
(A) - (4) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " sq

Four At A Time Flying Geese Block

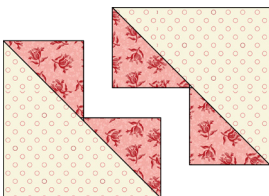
1. Place a 4" square with right sides together on the $7\frac{1}{2}$ " square in the opposite diagonal corners.
2. Draw a line diagonally according to diagram.
3. Stitch a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the line.



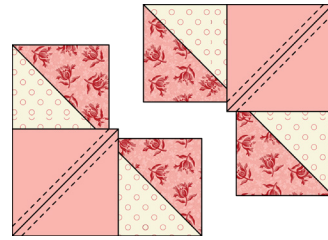
4. Cut apart on the line between the stitching.



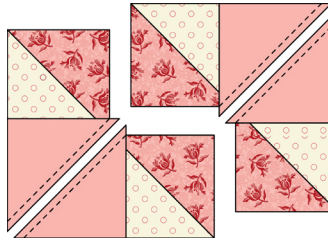
5. Press seams towards the smaller triangles.



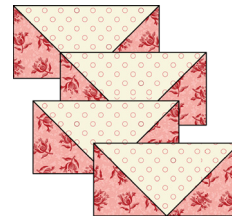
6. Place the remaining 4" squares in the corner of the large triangles right sides together.
7. Draw a line diagonally on the back of the 4" square according to diagram.



8. Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the line on both sides of the line.
9. Cut apart on the line.

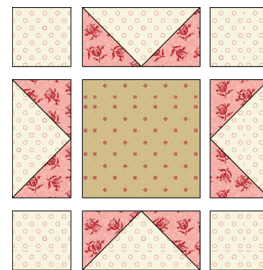


10. Press seam towards the smaller triangle.
11. Trim flying geese to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

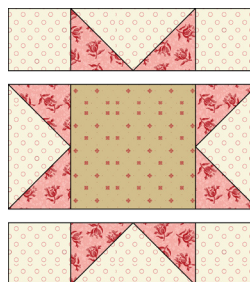


Assembly

1. Arrange block according to diagram.



2. Sew blocks together for each row.
3. Sew the rows together matching seams.
4. Press block.
