

Background Fabric	1 Fat Quarter
J - (4) 4 ½″ sq	

G-(4) 2¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" F-(1)5³/₄" sq

H-(2) 2" x WOF strips

Red Fabric

C - (4) 2 ¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" D-(1) 2" x WOF strips

Gray Floral Fabric

A-(1) 4 ½" sq

B-(1) 2" x WOF strips

Green Fabric

E-(4)3¹/₄" sq

Cutting For 24" Block

Background Fabric J-(4)6½″sa G-(4) 3¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" F-(1)7³/₄" sq H-(2) 3" x WOF strips

Red Fabric

C-(4) 3¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" D-(1) 3" x WOF strips

Gray Floral Fabric

A-(1)6¹/₂" sq





E-(4) 4¹/₄" sq


Four At A Time Flying Geese

- 1. Place a (E) square with right sides together on the (F) square in the opposite diagonal corners.
- 2. Draw a line diagonally according to diagram.
- 3. Stitch a 1/4" from each side of the line.
- 4. Cut apart on the line between the stitching.
- 5. Press seams towards the smaller triangles.







- 6. Place the remaining (E) squares in the corner of the large triangles right sides together.
- 7. Draw a line diagonally on the back of the (E) square according to diagram.




8. Sew a ¹/₄" from the line on both sides of the line. 9. Cut apart on the line.



- 10. Press seam towards the smaller triangle.
- 11. Trim flying geese to 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" for the 16" block and 6 1/2" x 3 1/2" for the 24" block






Strip Tube Ruler HST

- 1. Sew an (H) and (B) strip with right sides together on both sides of the length of the strip.
- 2. Repeat for an (H) and (D) strip.
- 3. Use the strip tube ruler; line up the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " line for a 16" block or the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " line for a 24" block, on the stitching along one side of the tube.
- 4. Cut the tube into a triangle with the tip of the ruler.
- 5. Rotate the tube and cut a triangle from the other side.
- 6. You need (8) HST for the (D) & (H) strip and (12) HST for the (B) & (H) strip.
- 7. Press seams open.



- 1. Sew the units together referring to the diagram on page 1.
- 2. Arrange units according to diagram below.



- 3. Starting at the top, sew units into rows.
- 4. Sew the rows together to finish the block.
- 5. Blocks should measure $16\frac{1}{2}$ or $24\frac{1}{2}$ depending on the size you have made.
