




Cutting

Background Fabric

1/2 yard

- D (2) 9 3/4" sq; cut diagonally for (4) triangles
- $E (1) 9 \frac{3}{4}$ sq
- F (2) 6 1/2" sq; cut diagonally for (4) triangles

1 Fat Eighth

C-(4)51/4"

Floral Fabric

1 Fat Eighth

A-(1)8½"sq




Four At A Time Flying Geese Block:

- 1. Place a (C) square with right sides together on the (E) square in the opposite diagonal corners.
- 2. Draw a line diagonally according to diagram.
- 3. Stitch a ¼" from each side of the line.




- 4. Cut apart on the line between the stitching.
- 5. Press seams towards the smaller triangles.






- 6. Place the remaining (C) squares in the corner of the large triangles right sides together.
- 7. Draw a line diagonally on the back of the (C) square according to diagram.




- 8. Sew a 1/4" from the line on both sides of the line.
- 9. Cut apart on the line.



- 10. Press seam towards the smaller triangle.
- 11. Trim flying geese to 4 ½" x8 ½".



- Sew the units together referring to the diagram on page 1.
- 2. Arrange units according to diagram below.



- 3. Starting with the center row, sew the units to each side of the center square.
- 4. Sew the rows together to finish the block.
- 5. Block should measure 24 ½".

Centennial Block
