Cutting

Background Fabric 1/2 yard

D - (2) 9 3/4" sq; cut diagonally for (4) triangles

E - (1) 9 3/4" sq

F - (2) 6 1/2" sq; cut diagonally for (4) triangles

Peach Fabric 1 Fat Eighth

C - (4) 5 1/4"

Floral Fabric 1 Fat Eighth

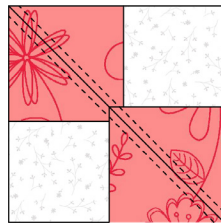
A - (1) 8 1/2" sq

Plaid Fabric 1 Fat Eighth

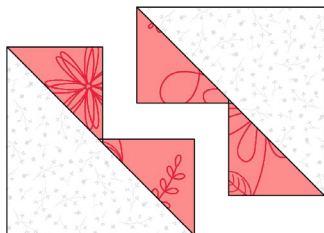
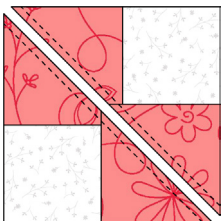
B - (4) 5 1/2" x 8 1/2"

Four At A Time Flying Geese Block:

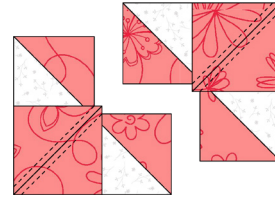
- Place a (C) square with right sides together on the (E) square in the opposite diagonal corners.
- Draw a line diagonally according to diagram.
- Stitch a 1/4" from each side of the line.



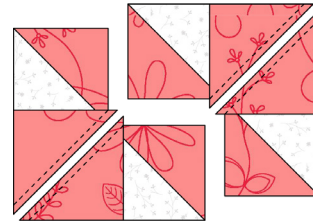
- Cut apart on the line between the stitching.
- Press seams towards the smaller triangles.



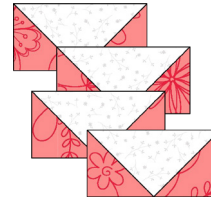
- Place the remaining (C) squares in the corner of the large triangles right sides together.
- Draw a line diagonally on the back of the (C) square according to diagram.



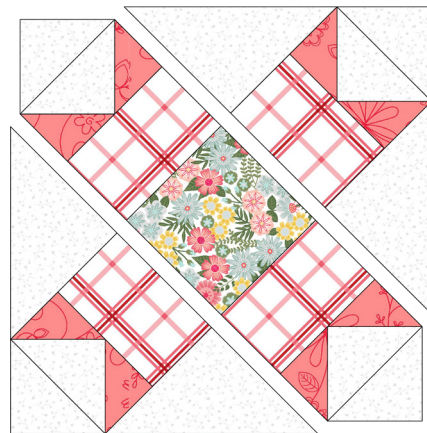
- Sew a 1/4" from the line on both sides of the line.
- Cut apart on the line.



- Press seam towards the smaller triangle.
- Trim flying geese to 4 1/2" x 8 1/2".



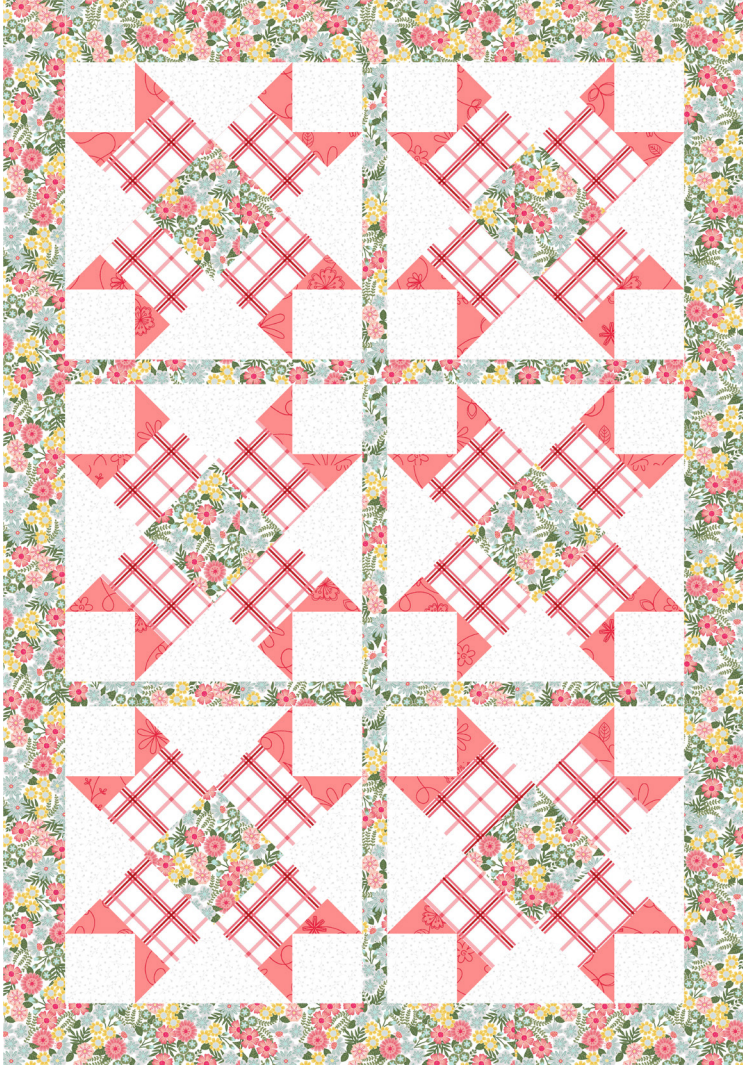
- Sew the units together referring to the diagram on page 1.
- Arrange units according to diagram below.



- Starting with the center row, sew the units to each side of the center square.
- Sew the rows together to finish the block.
- Block should measure 24 1/2".

Centennial Block
